This group will be working with our clergy, particularly our new associate priest, on the mission to connect St. Peter's to the 20 to 45 year old generations in our parish area. This work of congregational renewal is intended to complement the chancel renewal initiative in laying the ground work for successive chapters of the story of St. Peter's next 50 years.

The task force has undertaken its initial brainstorming meeting and is planning to initiate a pilot project in the fall including a contemporary worship service format, likely on a week day evening, and some social and programming elements targeted on these generations.
