

Today is the fourth Sunday of Lent, the traditional season of repentance that precedes Easter. In the early church, this was a time for new believers to prepare for baptism, which took place during the Easter Vigil service. During Lent, the hangings are purple, and greenery replaces the flowers at the Altar. The service is reordered, with the penitential rite beginning the service rather than following the prayers. We do not use the Gloria or say "alleluia" during this season. Instead, we will sing the Kyrie (Lord have mercy), Sanctus (Holy Holy) and the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God), using the traditional music by Merbecke. Our sermons during Lent and the Easter season will follow the journey of St. Peter, after whom our congregation is named.

THE GATHERING

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

New Testament Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:16-21 David Stewart

From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.
