*Today is the third Sunday of Lent, the traditional season of repentance that precedes Easter. In the early church, this was a time for new believers to prepare for baptism, which took place during the Easter Vigil service. During Lent, the hangings are purple, and greenery replaces the flowers at the Altar. The service is reordered, with the penitential rite beginning the service rather than following the prayers. We do not use the Gloria or say "alleluia" during this season. Instead, we will sing the Kyrie (Lord have mercy), Sanctus (Holy Holy) and the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God), using the traditional music by Merbecke. Our sermons during Lent and the Easter season will follow the journey of St. Peter, after whom our congregation is named.*

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

### **New Testament Reading: Isaiah 55:1-9** Alison Stewart
