He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes. Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? No slave can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."

In the mid 19 I was Chairman of the Fall Fair and also a member of Vestry. At a vestry meeting in December, a member of vestry proposed that because it took so much volunteer help to run

the Fair each year, people would get burned out. So she proposed that that we either cancel our Fair and join the one that was being held at Chinook Centre each year or hold ours every second year. The vestry had a lively discussion on this. Finally I said, "The Fall Fair is a great social event at St. Peter's as it gets all of us working together and getting to know each other better. It also adds four or five thousand dollars to church funds each year. I have enjoyed my term as Chairman and think the Fall Fair is great for the Church". Luckily the Rev. Mr. Smith agreed and with his support, the Vestry voted to continue it on an annual basis – although we did come close to losing our Fall Fair, as we have known it for the past thirty-five years.
